HIGHLIGHTS

- The National Institutes of Health awarded a five-year \$20 million grant to UIC's Center for Clinical and Translational Science, the largest grant in UIC's history.
- A market-based, competitive approach to increasing school choice actually leads to fewer educational opportunities for disadvantaged students in urban areas, according to research by Christopher Lubienski, Urbana professor of educational organization and leadership.
- Preeminent Lincoln scholar Michael A. Burlingame joined the UIS history department as the Naomi B. Lynn Distinguished Chair in Lincoln Studies.
- In a landmark collaboration with the Agency for Science, Technology and Research (A*STAR), the Urbana-Champaign campus opened its first research center outside of the United States at Singapore's Fusionopolis.

The three campuses encompass 2,558 acres, with additional holdings totaling 10,850 acres (including an airport, agriculture experiment fields, Allerton Park, research sites and natural areas).

- Renata Graw, a 2009 graduate of UIC's graphic design program and adjunct assistant professor, received a Gold Cube award from the New York-based international Art Directors Club for a book she developed for Chicago's bid to host the 2016 Olympics.
- The UIC Medical Center has the best one-year patient and graft survival rates in Chicago for adult kidney and kidney-pancreas transplantation.
- The UIS computer science department is part of a National Security Agency and Department of Homeland Security-sponsored program that works to reduce the vulnerability of the nation's information infrastructure.
- Scientists on the Urbana campus studying chemical bonds have shown that molecules don't always break faster when stretched, a result that may significantly impact the design of new high-tech polymers.



UIC is a member of a consortium of the top 52 medical institutions in the country committed to developing a master plan to address one of the leading causes of death and injury in children — brain injuries. Deborah Little, director of MRI research in neurology and rehabilitation, heads the project. UIC is the lead center for the state of Illinois as well as

a national lead center for rural/telehealth under the private Sarah Jane Brain Project. UIC has the nation's largest college of medicine with three branches outside Chicago.

UIC received a grant of nearly \$1 million from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development to study the benefits of green healthy housing for low-income residents. Principal investigator David Jacobs and a research team will evaluate the health and monetary benefits when low-income residents move from distressed, unhealthy public housing into green, affordable, healthy housing. The project will help policymakers learn whether substantial savings in medical care may be achieved by providing more healthy housing. Jacobs is a faculty member in the Department of Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences in the School of Public Health.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid of more than \$1 billion assisted U of I students in 2007-08, the latest year for which numbers are available. A total of 159,253 awards were made to 58,391 students in Urbana-Champaign, Chicago and Springfield. "Gift" aid, including scholarships, grants, fellowships and tuition and fee waivers, accounted for 46 percent of the total. Employment and loans covered 54 percent. Students earned more than \$173.8 million from university-related jobs in 2007-08.

VOLUNTARY SUPPORT

Fiscal Year 2009: \$221.4 million

In FY09, 146,732 separate gifts were made to the University of Illinois. During the five years ending in June 2009, the University and University of Illinois Foundation received more than \$962.2 million in gift income.

Brilliant Futures: The Campaign for the University of Illinois, the largest and most ambitious campaign in the history of the institution, has a goal of raising \$2.25 billion for students, faculty, research and the campus environment. As of August 31, 2009, the campaign has raised \$1.707 billion or 76% of the goal.


