The Urbana campus offers classes in downtown and suburban Chicago.

Highlights

- Leaders of UIC's Women in Science and Engineering program were recognized by President Barack Obama for their outstanding mentoring efforts. They received a 2011 Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics and Engineering Mentoring.
- Thirteen students from the Urbana-Champaign campus were awarded the prestigious Gilman Scholarship to study abroad, making the campus one of the top recipients of the award.
- UIS was named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll for the third year in a row. An estimated 700 UIS students volunteered approximately 57,000 community service hours.
- The UIC Library is developing an online portal to the historical collections of 14 museums, universities and libraries that make up the Chicago Collections Consortium. The portal will allow researchers to view the contents of thousands of shelves and boxes of materials with one click.
- Inc.com named EnterpriseWorks, a business incubator for technology firms located in the Research Park on the Urbana-Champaign campus, among the "10 Start-Up Incubators to Watch." EnterpriseWorks was chosen because of its versatile approach to working with entrepreneurs and the opportunities provided to start-ups.
- UIS welcomed scientists from around the Midwest for tours
 of the Alfred O. and Barbara Cordwell Therkildsen Field
 Station at Emiquon during the annual Midwest-Great Lakes
 Society of Ecological Restoration chapter meeting. Emiquon
 is a collaborative research facility working to restore more
 than 7,000 acres of farmland to its natural state.

Smart Skin: Electronic "tattoos" that track body activity

Engineering faculty in Urbana-Champaign have developed a circuit that bends, wrinkles and stretches similar to a temporary tattoo. The circuit combines

components for sensing, medical diagnostics, communications and human-machine interfaces, all of which can be used to track heart, brain and muscle activity as efficiently as conventional monitoring systems. The comfort of the technology allows researchers to better track an individual during normal activities.

Student Financial Aid

Financial aid of more than \$1.2 billion assisted U of I students in 2009-2010, the latest year for which numbers are available. A total of 173,158 awards were made to 62,512 students in Urbana-Champaign, Chicago and Springfield. "Gift" aid, including scholarships, grants, fellowships, and tuition and fee waivers, accounted for 45.3 percent of the total. Employment and loans covered 54.7 percent. Students earned more than \$191.9 million from university-related jobs in 2009-2010.

Voluntary Support: \$216.6 Million (FISCAL YEAR 2011)

In FY11, 147,300 separate gifts were made to the University of Illinois. During the five years ending in June 2011, the University and University of Illinois Foundation received more than \$1.05 billion in gift income. The Foundation and the University surpassed the Brilliant Futures Campaign goal of \$2.25 billion four months early. As of August 31, 2011, the campaign has gifts and commitments totaling \$2.267 billion.

Access Illinois: The Presidential Scholarship Initiative is a three-year initiative aimed at raising at least \$100 million in all forms of student support (scholarships, fellowships, awards/ prizes, and programs) with a special emphasis on current use and endowment funds to support scholarships for undergraduate, graduate, and professional students. The timeline for the initiative will be from July 1, 2011-June 30, 2014.
