The University of Illinois is the state's best and most comprehensive public university. The campuses in Urbana, Chicago and Springfield have a shared commitment to excellence in teaching, research, public service and economic development. An equally strong commitment to access to the University's educational programs strengthens the bond the institution has with the citizens of the State of Illinois.

The campuses in Urbana and Chicago are comprehensive research institutions that rank in the top 50 universities nationally for research and development dollars spent in science and engineering. Located in the state capital, the Springfield campus offers students an intimate liberal arts education with an emphasis on public affairs. The new Global Campus partners with the University's residential campuses to offer a variety of online degree and certificate programs.

The University of Illinois—one university with a common name and mission and a dedication to excellence and access.

Highlights

- UIC is the state's primary educator of physicians, dentists, pharmacists and other health professionals. With the nation's largest college of medicine and three locations outside Chicago, five other health sciences colleges and the state's major public medical center, UIC is a health care leader.
- Intel and Microsoft are collaborating with Urbana researchers in the Universal Parallel Computing Research Center that will develop ways to make use of parallel computing techniques that take maximum advantage of multi-core computer chips found in commodity computer systems. The Hewlett-Packard, Intel and Yahoo Cloud Computing Test Bed initiative will provide testing and research environments for "cloud computing" technologies that provide services to customers from a central location using devices in different locations.
- UIC's South Campus development, including the new UIC Forum event center and the James Stukel Towers residence hall, is transforming the campus environment. For the first time, half of UIC's first-year students live on campus.
- UIS enrolled its largest class of freshmen—300—in Fall 2008. The campus has more than 2,000 undergraduate students on its 750-acre campus near Lake Springfield.
- Entrepreneur, philanthropist, violinist and long-time patron of the arts Sheila Johnson, an Urbana alumna, endowed two chairs in music for her musical mentors, professors Daniel Perrino and Susan Starrett.
- UIC dentistry student Rajaa Alsanea's first novel, "The Girls of Riyadh," is a best-seller in the Middle East and has been translated into 20 languages.
- The Global Campus offers online bachelor's completion degrees, master's degrees and graduate certificates in partnership with the academic units and faculty of the three traditional campuses.
- Illini fans flocked to Pasadena in January for the 2008 Rose Bowl that capped a turnaround year for the football program.

Cambridge Bound

Urbana alumna **Julie Chami** was among 35 students nationally who received a Jack Kent Cooke scholarship valued at \$50,000 annually that supports students of exceptional promise. Chami, who received bachelor's degrees in political science and in economics and who founded Entrepreneurs Without Borders on campus, received funding for six years, the maximum, and will use the award first toward a graduate degree in development at the University of Cambridge, England, and, later, to pursue a doctorate in economics.

A stamp commemorating the achievements of two-time Nobel Prize-winner **John Bardeen** was unveiled on the Urbana campus in early 2008. A faculty member in physics for more than two decades, Bardeen was recognized for his co-invention of the transistor and early work in superconductivity. He was one of four scientists honored by the US Postal Service.

Blue Waters

The Blue Waters computing system will revolutionize science and engineering research and education. Part of the **National Center for Supercomputing Applications** (NCSA) and funded by the National

Science Foundation, Blue Waters will deliver sustained performance of one to two petaflops for scientific research and impact education through the Virtual School for Computational Science and Engineering and undergraduate curriculum initiatives. When it comes online in 2011, Blue Waters will be housed in a new state-of-the-art facility being built near the Urbana research park.

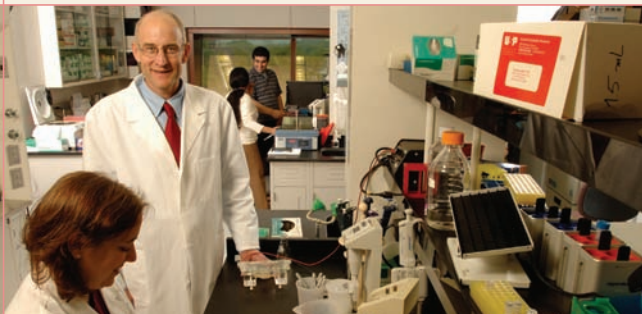

Autism Center of Excellence

UIC received a \$9.6 million grant from the National Institutes of Health to establish an interdisciplinary Autism Center of Excellence, the only Midwest site, to investigate underlying causes and potential treatment for repetitive behavior, a common problem related to autism. Professor of psychiatry **Edwin Cook** is a principal investigator, director of the Laboratory of Developmental Neuroscience at UIC's Institute for Juvenile Research and director of the UIC Autism Center of Excellence.

Addressing Diabetes

The Centers for Disease Control awarded UIC a \$4.2 million grant to target racial and ethnic health disparities in the prevalence of diabetes and cardiovascular disease among Latinos and African Americans. The award, to UIC's Midwest Latino Health Research, Training and Policy Center, leverages an on-going project in four Chicago neighborhoods and establishes UIC as one of 18 national Centers of Excellence in the Elimination of Health Disparities. The principal investigator is **Aida Giachello**, associate professor of social work and director of the UIC center.

UIC bioengineering student **Farah Shareef** won a highly competitive Fulbright fellowship to do medical research in London next year. An Honors College graduate who conducted research at Argonne National Laboratory, Shareef also was named a 2008 All-USA College Academic First Team member by *USA Today*, only one of 20 students nationwide to be honored. After completing her fellowship at Imperial College London, she will begin an M.D./Ph.D. program at UIC that focuses on prevention of vital organ damage.








STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid of \$953.3 million assisted U of I students in 2006-07, the latest year for which numbers are available. A total of 166,911 awards were made to 57,845 students in Urbana-Champaign, Chicago and Springfield. "Gift" aid, including scholarships, grants, fellowships and tuition and fee waivers, accounted for 47 percent of the total. Employment and loans covered 53 percent. Students earned more than \$171.2 million from university-related jobs in 2006-07.


