Campus locations: Urbana-Champaign, Chicago and Springfield. The UIC College of Medicine has regional campuses in Rockford, Peoria and Urbana. The UIC College of Pharmacy in Rockford welcomed its first class of students in the fall 2010 semester. The UIC College of Nursing has branch programs in Moline, Peoria, Rockford and Urbana. The University of Illinois at Springfield offers academic programs at the Peoria Center. The Urbana campus offers classes and services in downtown and suburban Chicago.



HIGHLIGHTS

- Former White House chief of staff Rahm Emanuel was a panelist at the 2010 Daley Global Cities Forum on the UIC campus. Emanuel, Chicago Mayor Richard Daley and leaders of more than 100 cities and local governments from around the world gathered to discuss urban issues with business, civic, academic and foundation leaders.
- The Urbana campus reduced its gross energy consumption by more than 12 percent between FY07 to FY10. That figure jumps to more than 15 percent when the gross square footage adjustment is factored into the campus' energy consumption for the same period.
- Members of the UIS community collected more than 6,200 pounds of food for the Central Illinois Foodbank as part of its 2009 Holiday Stars project. The UIS Volunteer and Civic Engagement Center coordinated the effort.
- UIC co-sponsored a regional meeting of leading scientists, physicians and community health experts to discuss the rapidly rising rates of diabetes and obesity in the US. The UIC Midwest Conference on Diabetes and Obesity was held in collaboration with the Institute of Medicine of the National Academies.
- An Extension website that introduces children to gardening was named one of 25 great websites for children by the American Library Association. "My First Garden" (urbanext.illinois.edu/firstgarden/) was developed by Urbana's Extension educators and website developers for fourth grade students.
- Members of UIS' Model United Nations Club were honored with the Outstanding Delegation Award, one of the group's highest honors, during a week-long conference in New York City in April 2010. The UIS delegation represented Azerbaijan and was one of 17 teams named out of more than 400 participating international colleges and universities.
- The state-of-the-art Business Instructional Facility on the Urbana campus is the first business facility at a public university to earn platinum certification through LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design), a rating system that measures sustainability in construction.
- Thanks to a \$25 million gift, UIC's College of Medicine at Peoria will construct the Jump Trading Simulation and Conference Education Center with state-of-the-art technology for medical students, nurses, residents and experienced clinicians to learn and practice new clinical skills in a safe environment.

Monitoring structural health



Urbana researchers have developed an inexpensive, reliable wireless means to continuously monitor the structural health of bridges

and they successfully deployed the system at full scale on the new Jindo Bridge in South Korea. A joint project between the Urbana campus, KAIST in Korea, and the University of Tokyo, it is the first dense deployment of a wireless sensor network on a cable-stayed bridge and the largest of its kind for civil infrastructure to date. Illinois Structural Health Monitoring Project researchers—led by Professor Bill Spencer of civil and environmental engineering and Professor Gul Agha of computer science—designed, developed and tested sensors that can be manufactured cheaply and still produce high-fidelity data required for structural health monitoring.

ELLNORA: The Guitar Festival, the third edition of the Krannert Center for Performing Art's biennial immersive guitar event, brought more than 13,000 guitar enthusiasts to Urbana in 2009 for riffing, plucking, and strumming artistry. Named for one of KCPA's benefactors, Ellnora Krannert, the festival featured 90 guitar virtuosos from around the world including Ani DiFranco, Keb' Mo' Band, and The Derek Trucks Band. UIC students named Schweitzer Fellows

Eight UIC students — in medicine, dentistry, nursing, urban planning and public affairs, and public health — were awarded Schweitzer fellowships, a service learning program for health professional students committed to helping Chicago's underserved communities. Cherese Pullum, a student in the UIC College of Nursing, is one of eight award winners who will each receive a \$2,000 honorarium and perform 200 hours of direct service in a community setting during a year-long project that is designed to improve health and access to care.

College of Pharmacy expands to Rockford

In direct response to the continuing shortage of pharmacists in Illinois, the UIC College of Pharmacy opened a regional site in Rockford in August 2010. The pharmacy program is housed in a newly-constructed 58,000-square-foot addition located on the campus of the UIC College of Medicine at Rockford. The new structure houses classrooms, a library, patient counseling rooms and administrative offices. The new northern Illinois campus will address the shortage of pharmacists throughout the state, especially in rural areas, by training and mentoring students as part of the Rural Pharmacy Program.

Eye for the city

Sculptor Tony Tasset, UIC professor of studio arts, unveiled “EYE” — a 30-foot sculpture in Pritzker Park in Chicago’s Loop during the summer of 2010 as part of Art Loop 2010, the inaugural event in a series that will focus on “one important artist” each summer with exhibitions, tours and discussions. The three-story eye was inspired by a photograph taken by Tasset’s son who is a UIC undergraduate in photography. The sculpture was the subject of numerous print articles and television coverage. Chicago also hosted Tasset’s “Cardinal,” 156 street banners that depict Illinois’ state bird in flight by mimicking flip-book animation. The banners lined the mile-long stretch of State Street from Wacker Drive to the Congress Expressway.

SPRINGFIELD

The University of Illinois at Springfield provides an intellectually rich, collaborative learning environment with small classes where professors truly know their students. The Springfield campus, thanks to its location in the state capital, supports faculty, staff and students as they conduct research and partner with state and nonprofit agencies to perform public service projects to improve regional, state, national and global communities. The campus is celebrating 15 years as part of the University of Illinois and forty years as a university. UIS, which had its largest fall enrollment in 2010, offers more than 40 degree-granting programs and is a recognized leader in online education. Students can also attend classes at UIS' Peoria Center.

A whole new ballgame

The Springfield campus became a full member of the NCAA and the Great Lakes Valley Conference in 2010. UIS director of athletics Rodger Jehlicka said the NCAA membership means all UIS student athletes will sign national letters of intent, the campus will be eligible for NCAA enhancement money, and millions of dollars in postgraduate scholarships will be available to students. UIS now offers 11 sports including men's and women's soccer, basketball, golf and tennis; men's baseball; and women's softball and volleyball.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid of more than \$1 billion assisted U of I students in 2008-09, the latest year for which numbers are available. A total of 161,059 awards were made to 60,002 students in Urbana-Champaign, Chicago and Springfield. "Gift" aid, including scholarships, grants, fellowships, and tuition and fee waivers, accounted for 45.5 percent of the total. Employment and loans covered 54.5 percent. Students earned more than \$184.9 million from university-related jobs in 2008-09.


In FY10, 150,700 separate gifts were made to the University of Illinois. During the five years ending in June 2010, the University and University of Illinois Foundation received more than \$1,022.5 million in gift income.

Brilliant Futures: The Campaign for the University of Illinois, the largest and most ambitious campaign in the history of the institution, has a goal of raising \$2.25 billion for students, faculty, research and the campus environment. As of September 30, 2010, the campaign has raised \$2.003 billion or 89% of the goal.


