I write to respond to your Freedom of Information request dated and received in my office on January 30, 2014, in which you requested:

"For the sake of clarity, my Jan. 30 FOIA explicitly sought "any and all RNUA forms" for these doctors. If there is an undue research burden on the staff, you can limit it to all RNUA forms since 2009."

Information responsive to your request is available and attached. These are public documents numbering 56 pages.

Portions of these documents have been redacted pursuant to the following section(s) of the Act:

• 140/7(1)(b) that exempts from disclosure "Private information, unless disclosure is required by another provision of this Act, a State or federal law or a court order." This includes UIN.

You have a right, under the law, to seek a review of this response by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) in the Office of the Attorney General. The PAC may be reached by phone at 217-782-1396, by email to publicaccess@atg.state.il.us, or by postal mail at the Public Access Bureau, 500 S. 2nd Street, Springfield, Illinois 62706. You also have the right to seek judicial review under section 11 of this Act.
