Dear Mr. Hopkins:

I write to respond to your Freedom of Information request dated and received in my office on April 3, 2015, in which you referenced a student athlete questionnaire form and requested:

"Pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, I am requesting the following information:

• All self-reported NCAA violations by all University of Illinois at Chicago athletics from Jan. 1, 2014 to the present."

Information responsive to your request is available and attached. These are public documents numbering 17 pages.

Portions of these documents have been redacted or withheld pursuant to the following section(s) of the Act:

- 140/7(1)(a) that exempts from disclosure "Information specifically prohibited from disclosure by federal or State law or rules and regulations implementing adopted under federal or State law." Specifically, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. §1232g) protects the privacy of student education records and prohibits the release of any information from a student's education record without the consent of the eligible student. Thus, identifiable student information was redacted from the responsive documents.
- 140/7(1)(b) that exempts from disclosure "Private information, unless disclosure is required by another provision of this Act, a State or federal law or a court order." This includes university identification numbers and other unique identifiers.
- 140/7(1)(c) that exempts from disclosure "Personal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which, if disclosed, would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless the disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information." This includes information about students and private citizens.

You have a right, under the law, to seek a review of this response by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) in the Office of the Attorney General. You also have the right to seek judicial review under section 11 of this Act.
