Dear Mr. Dasgupta:

I write to respond to your Freedom of Information request dated May 24, 2015, and received in my office on May 26, 2015, in which you requested:

“...the grade distributions by letter grade of the Spring 2015 semester of the following courses at the Urbana-Champaign Campus: ECE 340, ECE 329, ECE 486, ECE 361, ECE 330, and ECE 310.”

This is a public document and, if printed, would number 1 page.

The file provided to you is in XLS format. Because this file type allows for editing of the included data, we ask that prior to opening the files you accept responsibility for accurate dissemination of this information and agree that no manipulation of the file that results in falsification of the information will occur.

Portions of this document have been redacted pursuant to the following section(s) of the Act:

- 140/7(1)(a) that exempts from disclosure “Information specifically prohibited from disclosure by federal or State law or rules and regulations implementing adopted under federal or State law.” Specifically, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. §1232g) protects the privacy of student education records and prohibits the release of any information from a student’s education record without the consent of the eligible student. In this case, grade distributions are not displayed when a section has low enrollment or when all students in the class have the same grade. Because of the low enrollment in those classes or because all the students in a class received the same grade, the grade data could identify a student. Thus, such information was not provided to you as it would not only violate FERPA, but it would also be invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c) of the Act. In addition, teaching assistant names may have a value of “N/A” if the TA has requested anonymity under FERPA. Again, release of such information would both violate FERPA and be an invasion of personal privacy.
