Dear Dr. Draznin:

I write to respond to your Freedom of Information requests dated and received in my office on August 4, 2015, which you subsequently spoke with Kathy McCarthy from my office about on August 14, 2015. In these requests, you sought the following information:

“Any and all documents, including but not limited to emails, letters, memoranda, meeting minutes, manuals, rules, policy statements, and any other written materials, in whatever format, generated, received or transmitted by or within the UIS Division of Academic Affairs, relating to

- a) The number of tenure track faculty who have not yet been granted tenure at UIS, identified by College and Department, for the academic years 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, and 2015-16, as of August 15 and January 2, for each of these academic years;
- b) The number of tenured faculty at UIS, identified, by college and department, for the academic years 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, and 2015-16, as of August 15 and January 2, for each of these academic years;
- c) The number of tenured faculty identified by name, college and department who retired and were awarded Emeritus status from 2005 through June, 2015, identifying the academic year during which Emeritus status was recognized;
- d) All tenured faculty who retired and were awarded Emeritus status, identified by name, college and department, for each of the academic years from 2005-06 through 2014-15, separated by academic year, who were provided office location[s] by building and office number for each Emeritus faculty, by year, of both WIU building and non-WIS building offices.”

These are public documents and, if printed, would number 172 pages.

Portions of these documents have been redacted pursuant to the following section(s) of the Act:

- 140/7(1)(b) that exempts from disclosure “Private information, unless disclosure is required by another provision of this Act, a State or federal law or a court order.” This includes home addresses and personal phone numbers.

You have a right, under the law, to seek a review of this response by the Public Access Counselor (PAC) in the Office of the Attorney General. You also have the right to seek judicial review under section 11 of this Act.
