
THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS System

THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS SYSTEM IS AMONG THE PREEMINENT PUBLIC UNIVERSITY SYSTEMS IN THE NATION AND THE LARGEST COMPREHENSIVE SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN ILLINOIS.

Composed principally of its three best-in-class universities in Urbana-Champaign, Chicago, and Springfield, the U of I System is a powerhouse for education and discovery, and widely recognized as among the most innovative university systems in the world.

The U of I System boasts leading graduate and doctoral research centers, two medical schools, two law schools, world-class engineering and business colleges, top liberal arts colleges, an urban hospital system, regional health science campuses, and educational programs available to residents of all 102 Illinois counties.

In addition to its academic, research, public engagement, and healthcare missions, the U of I System is leading economic development efforts in the state of Illinois through unique partnerships such as the Illinois Innovation Network and the Discovery Partners Institute.

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign has been a **national and worldwide leader** in fighting the COVID-19 pandemic by developing a **robust testing and tracing strategy called SHIELD**, which includes a cost-effective, rapid saliva-based test.

The Grainger College of Engineering's Illinois Quantum Information Science and Technology Center will launch a **National Science Foundation Quantum Leap Challenge Institute for Hybrid Quantum Architectures and Networks** thanks to a \$25 million award.

A **Call to Action** initiative will support UIUC faculty research and establish working groups charged with **taking concrete steps to dismantle systemic racism and injustice.**





Led by the University of Illinois System in partnership with top regional and global research institutions, the Discovery Partners Institute (DPI) is a Chicago-based center,

focused on economic and workforce development. DPI does three things: talent development for high-demand tech jobs; applied research and development; and strengthening the city's tech ecosystem.

DPI will help retain the students we've educated, make our current workforce more skilled and diversify our tech talent pipeline, with an intentional focus on reaching underrepresented and underserved populations.

DPI launched an inaugural group of **eight world-class research teams** from the U of I System and partner universities with more than \$1 million in seed funding. The goal is to **develop these multi-disciplinary teams into international centers of excellence** that will achieve significant economic and societal impact in key sectors such as healthcare, food and agriculture, the environment, and construction.



The Illinois Innovation Network (IIN) links universities, communities, and industry to drive innovation and throughout the state

economic development throughout the state.

University of Illinois Board of Trustees Chairman Don Edwards and his wife, Anne, donated \$10 million to their alma mater, the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign – the largest gift ever by a U of I trustee. This gift will fund scholarships and athletics, as well as IIN and DPI.

The University of Illinois Chicago co-lead a **\$56 million, City of Chicago-funded contact tracing program** to aid the response to the COVID-19 pandemic and help stem the spread of the virus in Chicago.

A first-of-its-kind contraceptive developed at UIC called **Phexxi** was approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, and is **the fourth drug developed by researchers at UIC to achieve FDA approval.**

UIC will lead a new, **national consortium of 16 Hispanic-Serving Institutions** following a \$150,000 grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation.





Dedicated to the pursuit of health equity, UI Health provides comprehensive care, education, and research to foster healthy communities throughout Illinois and

train the next generations of healthcare leaders.

UI Health is an academic health enterprise that comprises the clinical services of the University of Illinois Hospital & Clinics and the seven UIC health science colleges. By delivering high-quality care for all, while providing access for our patients to innovative education and translational research, UI Health improves the health and well-being for the state of Illinois and beyond.

- More than 40 care locations throughout the state, including a 462-bed hospital, 26 outpatient clinics, and 14 federally qualified Mile Square Health Centers
- 17,447 inpatient discharges
- 454,658 outpatient clinic visits
- 1,000 physicians/advanced practitioners
- 45,089 emergency department visits
- 2,021 deliveries

In 2020, UI Health broke ground on the **Outpatient Surgery Center & Specialty Clinics** building, slated to open in fall of 2022. The new building will include six floors of patient care space, including eight operating and eight procedure rooms, 48 pre- and post-surgery bays, and clinic space.

UI Health is a clinical trial site for a **COVID-19 vaccine**. The Moderna vaccine candidate is an RNA-based vaccine designed to help the body produce antibodies that protect against COVID-19.

UI Health and the Illinois Department of Public Health received a \$9.5 million grant for a **maternal outcomes improvement project aimed at lowering pregnancy-related mortality rates.**



The University of Illinois Springfield is a regional university that emphasizes liberal arts and a broad engagement in public affairs issues. UIS is also a recognized leader in online education.

AFFORDABILITY

The U of I System is committed to holding the line on tuition and fulfilling its land-grant mission of access and affordability. This fall, in-state tuition increased for the first time in six years, a sub-inflationary increase that followed a five-year tuition freeze that was the longest in a half-century.

THE ILLINOIS GUARANTEE

Incoming undergraduate students enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program, including transfer students, receive a fouryear guaranteed lock on tuition rates.

AIM HIGH

High-achieving Illinois high school students have the opportunity to have tuition covered at each of the U of I System's three universities through a combination of state and university funds under the AIM HIGH program.

ILLINOIS COMMITMENT

A financial-aid program at Urbana-Champaign for qualified in-state students covers tuition and fees for those whose family income is less than \$67,100 a year.

UIC OPPORTUNITY GRANT

A new financial-aid program in 2019, the UIC Opportunity Grant awarded more than \$40 million in institutional funding to Illinois residents in its first year.
