
THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS SYSTEM

THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS SYSTEM is among the preeminent public university systems in the nation and the largest comprehensive system of higher education in Illinois.

Composed principally of its three best-in-class universities in Urbana-Champaign, Chicago, and Springfield, the U of I System is a powerhouse for education and discovery, and widely recognized as among the most innovative university systems in the world.

The U of I System boasts leading graduate and doctoral research centers, two medical schools, two law schools, world-class engineering and business colleges, top liberal arts colleges, an urban hospital system, regional health science campuses, and educational programs available to residents of all 102 Illinois counties.

In addition to its academic, research, public engagement, and healthcare missions, the U of I System is leading economic development efforts in the state of Illinois through unique partnerships such as the Illinois Innovation Network and the Discovery Partners Institute.

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign received the inaugural **Research Response to Community Crisis Award** from the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities for its COVID-19 SHIELD testing ecosystem.

Funded by a 10-year planned research investment, IBM and The Grainger College of Engineering at UIUC plan to launch a large-scale collaboration centered in the creation of the new **IBM-Illinois Discovery Accelerator Institute**.

The Urbana campus surpassed its fundraising goal a year ahead of schedule in the **“With Illinois” campaign**, recording nearly \$2.3 billion in gifts and commitments.



Led by the University of Illinois System in partnership with top regional and global research institutions, the **Discovery Partners Institute (DPI)** is a Chicago-based center,

focused on economic and workforce development. DPI does three things: talent development for high-demand tech jobs; applied research and development; and strengthening the city’s tech ecosystem.

DPI helps retain the students we’ve educated, makes our current workforce more skilled and diversifies our tech talent pipeline, with an international focus on reaching underrepresented and underserved populations.

In a second round of R&D seed grants, DPI awarded more than **\$1.5 million in funding to 12 research teams** from the U of I System and additional partner universities. Each team will receive \$125,000 to start the journey to economic and societal impact.



The **Illinois Innovation Network (iIN)** links universities, communities, and industry to drive innovation and economic development throughout the state.

iIN announced its first group of **innovation award winners** at the Illinois State Fair’s Tech Prairie STEAM Expo, recognizing individuals from the **iIN’s 15 hubs who have made key advances in research, technology commercialization and education**. Innovators were honored for developments in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the eye; robots that measure critical plant traits; converting biomass, coal and other substances into high-value chemicals and liquid fuels; more functional, touch-sensitive prosthetics; COVID-19 testing; and next-generation battery technology.



The University of Illinois Chicago is the city's **only public research university** and is one of the most ethnically and culturally diverse college campuses nationwide.

The University of Illinois Chicago broke ground on a new, 135,000-square-foot **Computer Design Research and Learning Center**.

UIC received a **\$40 million donation from philanthropist and novelist MacKenzie Scott**, the largest gift from an individual in school history, which will be **used to create a Student Success Fund**.

We Are Men, a program at UIC's Jane Addams College of Social Work, is on a mission to break down stereotypes of who young Black men are and of what they are capable.



Dedicated to the pursuit of health equity, UI Health provides comprehensive care, education, and research to foster healthy

communities throughout Illinois and train the next generations of healthcare leaders.

UI Health is an academic health enterprise that comprises the clinical services of the University of Illinois Hospital & Clinics and the seven UIC health science colleges. By delivering high-quality care for all, while providing access for our patients to innovative education and translational research, UI Health improves the health and well-being for the state of Illinois and beyond.

- More than 40 care locations throughout the state, including a 462-bed hospital, 26 outpatient clinics, and 14 federally qualified Mile Square Health Centers
- 17,325 inpatient discharges
- 508,343 outpatient clinic visits
- 1,100 physicians/advanced practitioners

- 1,769 deliveries

UI Health opened a **community vaccination site** at UIC's Credit Union 1 Arena in February and distributed 23 percent of all COVID-19 vaccine doses given in Chicago in its first day.

UI Health was selected as the first health system in Chicago to receive funding from Blue Cross Blue Shield Illinois as part of a new pilot program aimed at **improving health equity**.

UI Health performed more **kidney, kidney/pancreas and pancreas transplants** in 2020 than any other major medical center in the Chicago metropolitan area.



The University of Illinois Springfield is a regional university that emphasizes liberal arts and recently announced the formation of three new schools of Education, Public Management and Policy, and Politics and International Affairs.



The total FY 2022 operating budget* for the University of Illinois System is \$7.18 billion.


WHERE DOES THE MONEY COME FROM?

The U of I System is committed to holding the line on tuition and fulfilling its land-grant mission of access and affordability. Offering more grants and scholarships, our three universities are committed to widening doors of opportunity to more talented students.

THE ILLINOIS GUARANTEE

Incoming undergraduate students enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program, including transfer students, receive a four-year guaranteed lock on tuition rates.

AIM HIGH

High-achieving Illinois high school students have the opportunity to have tuition covered at each of the U of I System's three universities through a combination of state and university funds under the AIM HIGH program.

ILLINOIS COMMITMENT

A financial-aid program at Urbana-Champaign for qualified in-state students covers tuition and fees for those whose family income is less than \$67,100 a year.

UIC OPPORTUNITY GRANT

The UIC Opportunity Grant provides up to \$3,700 in funding for Illinois resident undergraduates with demonstrated financial need.
